addition, Illinois In the Compiled Statues state: "No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle shall permit it to stand unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key from the ignition, effectively setting the brake thereon and, when standing any perceptible upon turning the front wheels to the curb or side of the highway."

So, please remember to keep your vehicle doors locked and do not leave your vehicle unattended while it is running.



Abusing Inhalants

What is inhalant abuse?

An inhalant can be almost any aerosol or liquid solvent. Oven cleaner, model glue, spray paint, correction fluid, paint thinner and polyurethane are just a few of the household products that young people may try to inhale. They breathe in the fumes of the product directly from its container, known as "snorting." Or, they soak a rag in the product, put the rag over their nose and inhale the fumes, known as "huffing." Or,

they pour the product into a bag, which they hold over their mouth and nose while they inhale the fumes, known as "bagging."

How can I tell if my child is using inhalants to get high?

It may be hard to recognize the signs of inhalant abuse. Teenagers who use inhalants may have chapped lips or faces, paint stains on their hands and clothes, runny noses, a funny odor on their breath or bloodshot eyes. They may complain of headaches, dizziness or trouble with their memory, sleep or vision.

What does it do to the body?

Inhaling solvents can cause sudden death because the heart stops. It also can be the cause of fires, falls, car crashes and drownings. Inhalants block oxygen flow to the brain and every other organ in the body. Continued abuse can kill your child as a result of slow damage to every organ. If your child is abusing inhalants, he or she is likely to try other kinds of drugs, especially alcohol and marijuana.

Why are we discussing this topic?

These types of drug practices have happened in Yorkville and again recently there has been an increased usage within the teen population of Yorkville. encourage you to educate yourself about these easily accessible, yet highly dangerous, drugs.
