

## TRAFFIC COMPLAINT / ENFORCEMENT INFORMATION

In **June 2025**, the Yorkville Police Department had received traffic concerns for various locations in town. These concerns were established through both citizen concerns and areas of concern for the department. All citizen concerns were tracked for potential issues. In some cases, to verify that the concerns needed to be further addressed, (5) five years of crash data was researched. In addition, these locations were further researched by utilizing the department's speed signs. These speed signs were able to collect traffic data related to traffic counts, speed data, and various times of day of violations. In addition, the department also relied upon its partnership with EEI.

## DETECTIVE SQUAD

On June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025, the Yorkville Police Department took a call for service regarding a missing juvenile, later identified as Aiyana Williams (16 years old). The Investigations Unit began assisting patrol units that afternoon. On June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025, the Investigations Unit became assigned the investigation. During the search for Aiyana, outside civilian and law enforcement assistance was requested and received, including Bloodhound canines, horse mounted search party, drone operators, search and rescue teams, and the Kendall County Major Crime's Task Force. On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2025, patrol officers located a deceased person in the search area for Aiyana. The investigation into Aiyana's disappearance and the recovered remains is still on going.

On June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025, Detective Ketchmark was able to obtain an arrest warrant for David Kur for Burglary and Criminal Damage to Property. These charges are the result of an investigation into a Burglary that occurred in September of 2024 at a business located in the 8500 Block of Route 126. Kur is still wanted at this time.
