

Facebook Post (8/11/25): Sweet!! The week we've ALL been waiting for...back to school!!! As we prepare for the first day back, YPD wants to remind everyone about Illinois school bus laws. It is illegal - and dangerous - to pass a school bus when its stop arm is extended, and lights are flashing (even in a bus lane). Please stay alert, especially as we all get used to the new fall routine and help ensure every student arrives at school safely.



When do I need to stop?
All school buses in Illinois are required to have stop sign safety arms. Motorists have to stop if the arm is extended or flashing lights are lit.

TWO-LANE ROADS



On two-lane roads, all traffic in both directions must stop if there's a stopped school bus.

FOUR (OR MORE)-LANE ROADS



When a school bus is traveling on a four-lane road with at least two lanes of traffic going in the opposite direction, only the lanes of traffic traveling in the same direction as the school bus must stop.

ONE WAY ROADS



When a school bus is traveling on a one-way roadway and is stopped to pick up or drop off pupils, all lanes of traffic must stop, regardless of the number of lanes.



Facebook Post (8/15/25): Arrest Made Following Ongoing Investigation

This week, the Yorkville Police Department Investigations Unit arrested Andrew Lasater, 21, of Yorkville, Illinois, following the completion of an investigation that began in March of this year. Lasater was taken into custody on five counts of Dissemination of Child Pornography (Class X felonies).

In March, the Yorkville Police Department received an internet tip indicating that Lasater was in possession of illegal digital files. Shortly afterward, investigators executed a search warrant at his residence during which evidence was collected and submitted to the Illinois Attorney General's Office for digital forensic examination.

The results of the examination indicated that Lasater had disseminated illegal files over the internet at which point an arrest warrant was issued for Lasater. He was taken into custody on Monday August 11th without incident and transported to the Kendall County Jail.

Yorkville Police were assisted in this investigation by the Plano Police Department, Kendall County Criminal Intelligence Team, Kendall County Special Response Team, and the Illinois Attorney General's Office.

Charges are not proof of guilt. The defendant listed in this release is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial, at which it is the burden of the State to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.

Facebook Post (8/22/25): We recognize recent concerns regarding enforcement of the City’s newly passed ordinance regulating public camping within the corporate boundaries of Yorkville. It is important that our community understands our approach is rooted in compassion, partnership, and public safety.

City leadership recently met with community members to hear their concerns about the public camping ordinance and our available social services. That meeting was productive, and participants agreed to partner with the City to identify solutions that support our unhoused individuals while also addressing broader community needs. We expect to continue public discussion at future public meetings to include an informative presentation on City and Police Department ongoing efforts. This is a complex issue to address and as such we would like to provide context for our community and set expectations of our Police Department as we navigate this process.

The Yorkville Police Department has prioritized crisis intervention since the creation of the Crisis Intervention Team in 2021. Currently the Department has 85% of its patrol force certified in crisis intervention, with multiple representatives on all patrol shifts. Each year the Department trains additional officers in crisis intervention, as classes become available, with the goal of 100% of the patrol staff being certified as crisis intervention officers. Crisis intervention involves a variety of calls for service ranging from actions of self-harm, mental health challenges, developmental delays, autism awareness, de-escalation techniques, as well as those experiencing homelessness. It is daily that Yorkville officers utilize this training. The mission of our Crisis Intervention Team is to work alongside our community members experiencing a crisis to reduce stigma and connect them with opportunities for a safe and healthy future through a wide range of assistance programs.

The Department’s CIT program offers focused assistance for challenges including mental health, substance addiction, inpatient/outpatient behavioral health, veterans’ assistance, LGBTQI+ assistance, suicide prevention, senior services, as well as homelessness prevention, street outreach and emergency shelter placement. This is accomplished through a network of partnerships inside and outside of Kendall County. We are proud to partner with The Kendall County Health Department, Kendall County Senior Services, Mutual Ground of Aurora, Daybreak Center by the Catholic Diocese of Joliet, and the Will, Grundy, Kendall Continuum of Care community action program to aid our Yorkville residents. While connecting individuals to services is not always successful, we remain committed to offering these resources during each interaction. Recently, we

were able to assist one unhoused resident in securing temporary assistance which had been declined in the past. A small success we are proud to share and a testament to the importance of continually building trust among all members of our community.

As of today's date, the public camping ordinance has not yet been enforced. The City's focus is on training staff in a compassionate application of the ordinance and exhausting all social service options before considering enforcement. This ordinance was enacted in response to repeated calls for service over the past several years such as trespassing at businesses, disorderly conduct toward citizens, and disturbing the peace in public settings. The Yorkville Police will continue to address these calls as they come in and will respond appropriately. We encourage residents to report concerns as they arise.

Our vision is to work in partnership with each person we serve to ensure Yorkville remains a safe, healthy, and welcoming place to call home. We remain committed to pursuing excellent service to our community and thank you for your support as we navigate this complex challenge together

TRAFFIC COMPLAINT / ENFORCEMENT INFORMATION

As of **August 2025**, the Yorkville Police Department had received traffic concerns for various locations in town. These concerns were established through both citizen concerns and areas of concern for the department. All citizen concerns were tracked for potential issues. In some cases, to verify that the concerns needed to be further addressed, (5) five years of crash data was researched. In addition, these locations were further researched by utilizing the department's speed signs. These speed signs were able to collect traffic data related to traffic counts, speed data, and various times of day of violations. In addition, the department also relied upon its partnership with EEI.

DETECTIVE SQUAD

On August 8th, 2025, Detective Ketchmark was able to secure an arrest warrant for Andrew Lasater (20 years old) for 5 counts of Child Pornography (Class X charges). These charges stemmed from an investigation that began in March of 2025 after the Yorkville Police Department received a cyber tip of criminal online activity of a Yorkville area resident. In May of 2025, a search warrant was obtained and executed at Lasater's residence. In July, the charges against Lasater were approved and then the warrant was issued. Lasater turned himself into the Yorkville Police Department on August 11th, 2025 and was transported to the Kendall County Jail. Charges are not proof of guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
