

Facebook Post (9/16/25): UPDATE (Posted above on 9/16/2025 - 4:05 PM) Man Flees Courthouse During Warrant Service

Shortly after 11:00 AM, 32-year-old Rayvon Johnson fled from the Kendall County Courthouse as deputies attempted to take him into custody on an outstanding failure to appear warrant for domestic battery.

Johnson entered the courthouse and went through the security screening checkpoint at the main entrance. While Johnson was conducting his business at the courthouse, it was discovered that a Kendall County warrant had recently been issued for failing to appear for court on a 2022 domestic battery case. As deputies attempted to take him into custody, he fled. While attempting to run away, he pushed past a deputy who was attempting to stop him. He exited the courthouse heading east on foot. Johnson was not incarcerated at the Kendall County Jail, nor was he in the custody of the Sheriff's Office prior to this incident, and it is not considered an escape.

He did not make any threats or give any indication that he intended to do anything other than avoid apprehension. He was wearing black shorts and a black shirt. He is approximately 6'4" tall and weighs between 150 and 160 pounds.

A K9 team and drones were utilized to attempt to locate Johnson. A K9 track was performed, and the track concluded at a location where he was possibly picked up in a vehicle. That, taken along with other evidence and information developed during this investigation, indicates he is likely no longer in the area.

This remains an active investigation.

ORIGINAL:

Shortly after 11:00 AM, 32-year-old Rayvon Johnson ran from the Kendall County Courthouse as deputies attempted to take him into custody on an outstanding failure to appear warrant for domestic battery.

Johnson was last seen heading east from the courthouse on foot. He was wearing black shorts and a black shirt. He is approximately around 6'2" to 6'4" tall and weighs between 150 and 160 pounds. The Sheriff's Office is working with our law enforcement partners, utilizing K9 teams and drones to attempt to locate Johnson.

Johnson does not appear to pose an immediate public safety threat; however, we are asking area residents to remain vigilant and contact us at 630-553-5856 to report any suspicious activity.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINT / ENFORCEMENT INFORMATION

As of **September 2025**, the Yorkville Police Department had received traffic concerns for various locations in town. These concerns were established through both citizen concerns and areas of concern for the department. All citizen concerns were tracked for potential issues. In some cases, to verify that the concerns needed to be further addressed, (5) five years of crash data was researched. In addition, these locations were further researched by utilizing the department's speed signs. These speed signs were able to collect traffic data related to traffic counts, speed data, and various times of day of violations. In addition, the department also relied upon its partnership with EEI.
