

COMMUNITY POLICING INITIATIVES

Community Information

Facebook Post (10/07/25): Investigation Completion - On June 16th, 2025, Yorkville Police received a report of a missing juvenile from the 900 block of Fawn Ridge Ct. at which point a missing persons investigation began. During the investigation Yorkville Officers located human remains near the area in which the juvenile was reported missing. Yorkville Police were assisted by the Kendall County Coroner’s Office to continue the investigation. On September 17th the Kendall County Coroner’s Office released findings that positively identified the remains as Aiyana Williams and classified the death as undetermined.

There has been a great amount of misplaced speculation online regarding the details of this case, however Investigators are compelled to rely solely on verified evidence and expert analysis throughout the course of an investigation. Yorkville police have completed a comprehensive investigation that included a post-mortem examination, toxicological analysis, entomological analysis, DNA testing, extensive interviews, and digital forensic examinations of family members’ mobile devices. Investigators have determined there is no evidence to suggest that Aiyana’s death resulted from abuse, self-inflicted injuries, foul play, or any criminal involvement.

The Yorkville Police Department extends its deepest sympathies to Aiyana’s family and expresses sincere gratitude for their cooperation during the investigation.

Yorkville Police would also like to extend our gratitude to all our law enforcement partners and Yorkville community who assisted in this investigation.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINT / ENFORCEMENT INFORMATION

As of **October 2025**, the Yorkville Police Department had received traffic concerns for various locations in town. These concerns were established through both citizen concerns and areas of concern for the department. All citizen concerns were tracked for potential issues. In some cases, to verify that the concerns needed to be further addressed, (5) five years of crash data was researched. In addition, these locations were further researched by utilizing the department's speed signs. These speed signs were able to collect traffic data related to traffic counts, speed data, and various times of day of violations. In addition, the department also relied upon its partnership with EEI.

Downtown: Below are traffic data comparison from the study collected between 05-25-2025 to 06-25-2025

- Northbound: Approximate 40% Reduction in speeding rate
- Southbound: Approximate 23% Reduction in speeding rate
- Note: Approximate 27% Reduction in speeding rate for southbound vehicles traveling 41-45 mph

DETECTIVE SQUAD

On October 23rd, the Yorkville Police Department Investigations Unit participated in a county wide Sex Offender and Violent Offender registration check. On that date, the Investigations Unit made contact with 5 registrants and confirmed that they're registration information was correct and that there were no violations. During the entire month of October, the Investigations Unit had 6 additional contacts with Sex Offenders and Violent Offenders.

On October 23rd, Detective Ketchmark was able to secure a felony arrest warrant for Christian Page for 1 count of Criminal Abuse of a Person with a Disability and 2 counts of Aggravated Battery. These charged from an investigation into Page that began in September of 2025. Page, a former caretaker at local group home for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, was

accused of striking a client of that group home. After a diligent investigation, charges against Page were approved. Page did turn himself into another agency that same day.
