

Dear resident,

The City is in the beginning stages of transitioning its City-wide water source from deep underground aquifers to a Lake Michigan water source via the DuPage Water Commission. This water source change is expected to be complete in 2028 and was contemplated by the City Council as far back as 2014, when the City Council began to study the long-term viability of the underground aquifers for the City's use as a future water source. Our current water source, the Ironton-Galesville aquifer, is being depleted at twice the rate it is replenished. Without action, projections show we could face a severe water shortage within the next 20 years. This is not just a local issue—it's a regional challenge affecting many growing communities.

In preparation for this water source change, the City has been completing watermain replacement projects across town. During these projects, our staff is routinely asked about data center projects proposed in town, and if the watermain replacement projects or the switch to a Lake Michigan water source is due to water demand from data centers. For your use, are the following facts about the Lake Michigan water source project and data centers:

### Fact 1

The City is transitioning to a Lake Michigan water source because the existing community's water usage is unsustainable, near term and long-term. There are no data centers currently built in Yorkville, and so data centers are not a factor in the decision to move to a Lake Michigan water source. If no data centers are ever built in Yorkville, the City would still need to move to a Lake Michigan water source.

### Fact 2

Many of Joliet area communities use the same deep underground aquifer as Yorkville, and collectively these Joliet area communities use vastly more water than Yorkville. Even if the Joliet area transitions to a Lake Michigan water source (which they are expected to do by 2030) and stops using the underground aquifers, the region is still using the underground aquifers at an unsustainable rate for Yorkville's long-term use. This has been confirmed by the Illinois State Geological Survey as they have performed detailed modeling of the deep aquifers in the region.

### Fact 3

Yorkville is restricting data center projects proposed water use so that data centers, if built in Yorkville, will use less water than a residential subdivision on equivalent acreage. For instance, a residential subdivision at 2.8 houses per acre, 2.9 people per household, and utilizing 75 gallons of water per day per person would use 609 gallons of water per acre per day. The

only data center project that has been approved by the City Council in full is Cyrus One which is projected to use 393 gallons of water per acre per day. Other data center projects proposed in Yorkville are expected to use 236 or 333 gallons of water per acre per day. Yorkville's City Council is requiring data centers to use air-cooled or closed-loop water cooled systems that use water in a less intensive manner.

#### Fact 4

The only water infrastructure project in Yorkville that is caused by a data center is a large watermain loop that is being installed in and around the Cyrus One data center project on Eldamain Road near the Faxon Road intersection; this data-center-caused infrastructure project has been paid for 100% upfront by Cyrus One at a cost of more than \$8,000,000. Cyrus One will also have to pay water connection fees to the City, similarly to every other development project in Yorkville. This water connection fee will take into account the prior investments the Yorkville community has made in its water system (i.e. they will be "buying-in" to the system already paid for by taxpayers) and Cyrus One will have to pay the same water rates as everyone else in town.
