What is the status of Yorkville's Integrated Transportation Plan?



The United City of Yorkville is pleased to provide a status of the Integrated Transportation Plan (ITP) including the Shared-Use Trail Plan and Downtown Streetscape Plan. The project is well underway and many exciting things are happening. Several meetings have occurred, survey results are coming in and exhibits are being drafted at this time. Provided in this newsletter is an update on the overall project and future meeting dates are provided so you can be involved in the process.

What is the status of the Shared-Use Trail Master Plan?

Goals and Objectives are complete...

One of the first steps in this process was to establish goals and objectives. This task has been completed with input from the public, ITP Task Force Committee and City Staff and leaders. Some of the goals* that have been established are:

- · Provide local and regional trail connectivity
- Protect the Fox River and other natural features
- Explore and pursue funding options for trails
- Ensure safety and security on local trails

First Public Workshop held December 4, 2008... In addition to goals and objectives being completed, the first public workshop was held. There

was a good turnout, and after a brief presentation, the attendees divided into groups and completed a survey, discussed aspects of the plan and provided input on the ITP. Additionally, each group illustrated their ideas on maps and created a conceptual trail master plan identifying desired trail locations and connections. The group also provided input on prioritization of the implementation of the trail system. Priorities included:

- Focus on completing unconnected local trails (fill in the gaps where trails do not currently connect)
- Make connections to important regional trails (i.e. Fox River Trail ranked the highest and the second highest rated was the Virgil Gilman Trail)
- Add more local trails create links between residential neighborhoods, schools and parks
- Provide safe walkways and trails for children to walk or bike to schools

Additionally, attendees were provided with a list of potential trail corridors and were asked to priortize (from most desired to least desired) corridors to travel by bicycle. Below are the results of their input:

Priority # 1 - Route 34 Priority # 2 - Route 47

Priority # 3 - Fox River Corridor

What is the status of the Downtown Streetscape Plan?


Goals and Objectives are complete...

The Downtown Streetscape Plan which includes a Pedestrian System Analysis and Design Standards for Streetscape Elements is well underway. Some of the goals* that have been established are:

- Improving pedestrian and bicycle accessibility and circulation in the core downtown as well as providing connections to the greater study area
- Providing guidelines for an overall theme and character to help steer future streetscape development improvements
- Creating design standards for streetscape elements such as signage, lighting, benches, bike racks, planter boxes and sidewalk paving




THE PEDESTRIAN ENVIRONMENT IS A KEY FOCUS OF THE DOWNTOWN STREETSCAPE PLAN

Downtown Streetscape Plan exhibits are being drafted...

Exhibits and information are being created for the Downtown Streetscape Plan and will be available for review at the next Public Workshop on May 14th. Below is a summary of the information that will be presented:

- Theme and character study to select a desired style or "look" of the downtown in order to set the stage for future development.
- Visual Preference Survey Results
- Pedestrian System Analysis The project team is producing a map to demonstrate current and future pedestrian circulation in the downtown area. Associated street cross sections will help to define how development and streetscapes should occur in the future.

Can I still get involved in the ITP?

As a resident of the Yorkville area you are invited to participate in the development of the ITP and provide valuable input. Plan to attend the two additional Task Force Meetings in March and the Public Workshop being held in May. The Public Workshop is a great opportunity to review and provide input into the exhibits and draft report. When will the ITP study be complete?

The ITP study is on schedule and a final report will be complete by June of 2009. The final step in the process will be the Economic Development Committee to recommend approval of the ITP to the City Council. It is anticipated to be on the City Council agenda in July of 2009.
